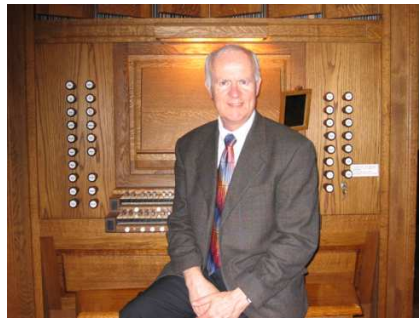


# SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

"Something for Everyone" is the title. The program will feature composers whose anniversaries fall in 2013, a brilliant Canadian composer and then composers who treat the organ with humour and whimsy.

The big Prelude and Fugue in C major by Johann Krebs, who was born 300 years ago, opens the program. Rachel Laurin, the Ottawa-based composer, gives us a virtuosic and passionate Prelude and Fugue. Salamanca, by the Swiss organist-composer Guy Bovet, evokes the fiery Spanish organs of the 17th century. British composer Simon Lesley calls up memories of the Last Night at the Proms at Royal Albert Hall in his "Britannia Waives the Rules". Finally, our favourite pet dogs and cats come to mind in pieces by Canadian Denis Bédard and American Robin Dinda. The recital will be on June 8 in Fulda Dom (cathedral)--birthplace of St. Boniface, apparently.
