The Communion of the People

Music during Communion: 132 Of the Father's Love Begotten

The practice of intinction (dipping the wafer into the wine) is a practice that we discourage. We offer communion in both kinds bread & wine. Receiving bread or wine is receiving the fullness of the eucharist. (bread only; or wine only. A common practice for acknowledging the cup without receiving – is to reverently touch the base of the cup when it is presented. This has often been offered to those not receiving alcohol for personal reasons. An alternative is to simply cross your arms on your chest when offered the chalice.
