Then they arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me" for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" He said, "Legion"; for many demons had entered him. They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss. Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding; and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned. When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country. Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.

The Celebration of Baptism Thanksgiving Over the Water

Robert+ The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Robert+ Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Robert+ We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship Breanna, who comes to Him in faith, baptizing her in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify ✠ this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that Breanna is here cleansed from sin and born again, she may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

The Baptismal Covenant

The celebrant then says, addressing the entire congregation.

Let us join with Breanna who is committing herself to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Robert+ Do you believe in God the Father?

All **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Robert+ Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
All **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Robert+ Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
All **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Robert+ Will you continue in the apostles teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
All **I will, with God's help.**

Robert+ Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?
All **I will, with God's help.**

Robert+ Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?
All **I will, with God's help.**

Robert+ Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?
All **I will, with God's help.**

The Baptism

The celebrant will baptise Breanna with water in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

She will then be signed with the cross using chrism oil.

The celebrant prays over the newly baptized, saying,

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon Breanna the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

The Giving of the Light

One of the ministers will then give to Breanna (via his sponsors) a lighted candle, saying,
Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

Then the people say,

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.


