

The Celebration of Baptism Thanksgiving Over the Water

Now sanctify ✠ this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that Hezekiah is here cleansed from sin and born again, he may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour.

The Baptismal Covenant

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

All **I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

The Baptism

The celebrant will baptise Hezekiah with water in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

He will then be signed with the cross using chrism oil.

The celebrant prays over the newly baptized, saying,

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon Hezekiah the forgiveness of sin, and have raised him to the new life of grace. Sustain him, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give him an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

The Giving of the Light

One of the ministers will then give to Hezekiah (via his sponsors) a lighted candle, saying,

Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

Then the people say,

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.



Pastoral Letter from The Rev'd Robert Clifford
to All Saints' Anglican Church, Windsor

July 19, 2019

My dear siblings in Christ,

*Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;
I have called you by name, you are mine.*

Isaiah 43:1

You are beloved by God. You are beloved by me. I hope that you already know these things, but they bear repeating.

Our beloved church, The Anglican Church of Canada, has been busy this week. My goodness, has it ever!

On Tuesday, The General Synod of the Anglican Church of Canada concluded its triennial convention in Vancouver with the installation of our 14th Primate (principal national bishop). She had been elected to the role from among five capable candidates from across the country. She happens, of course, to be our very own The Right Reverend (now, The Most Reverend) Linda Nicholls.

++Linda and the Diocese of Huron will now begin a ninety-day period of transition, with ++Linda taking up her new national responsibilities and entrusting her local ones to an administrator. The Diocese of Huron will begin the processes for electing a new Diocesan Bishop in pretty short order. Please hold Archbishop Linda, the Anglican Church of Canada, and the Diocese of Huron in your prayers during this transitional time.

Also, among the business undertaken at General Synod was the establishment of a self-governing Indigenous Ecclesiastical Province of the Church within Canada. This will have, I believe, a positive effect on our ongoing relationship building ministry with the Walpole Island First Nation and The Church of St. John the Baptist at Walpole Island. The National Indigenous Bishop has been elevated to be the Metropolitan of this new province and is now styled The Most Reverend Mark MacDonald. Please hold Archbishop Mark, the indigenous church, and our friends at St. John's Walpole Island in your prayers as they begin the exciting and hard work of setting their course forward.

And now the most difficult matter, for me and many Anglicans, the changes to the National Canon Law on marriage to permit clergy, with their Bishop's permission, to marry all legally eligible couples within the Anglican Church of Canada have narrowly failed to achieve the required two-thirds majority among Bishops, clergy, and lay delegates to the Synod.

Overall, the vote achieved significant majority support among all three categories of delegates – achieving 80% support among the lay delegates, and nearly 75% support among the clergy delegates, and it DID have the support of 62% of the bishops...just not the required 66.7%.

As it stands now Bishop Linda has granted her permission for parishes and clergy to celebrate marriage without regard to gender. There is a process that she requires us to undertake to consider this option. “Same-sex marriages will be permitted in parishes where the priest and the Parish Council have considered this matter and agreed that the parish will do so. Any parish desiring to do so will write a letter to the Bishop requesting permission - signed by the priest (rector/incumbent) and the Wardens and including a description of the consideration taken by the Parish Council.” I propose to undertake the required Parish Council deliberations expeditiously, beginning with a Parish Council meeting called for Wednesday, July 24th @ 7pm.

I look forward to blessing and, eventually, celebrating marriages for all people who look to bring their relationship before God and the community here at All Saints’, Windsor.

To date we have raised \$555.00, almost at our goal.
