

All to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hidden. Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Glory to God

Celebrant Glory to God in the highest,
**All and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly king, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.
Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.
For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**



Act of Reception

If for any reason you wish to remain at your seat and not receive the bread of the Holy Eucharist today, please feel free to pray the following from your seat to join yourself spiritually to the act of taking Communion.

“In union, dear Lord, with the faithful at every altar of thy Church where thy blessed Body and Blood are being offered to the Father, I desire to offer thee praise and thanksgiving. I believe that thou art truly present in the Holy Sacrament. And since I cannot now receive thee sacramentally, I beseech thee to come spiritually into my heart. I unite myself unto thee, and embrace thee with all the affections of my soul. Let me never be separated from thee. Let me live and die in thy love. Amen.

Come Lord Jesus, dwell in thy servant in the fullness of thy strength, in the perfection of thy ways, and in the holiness of thy spirit, and rule over every hostile power in the might of thy Spirit, and to the glory of the Father. Amen.

May the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ preserve my body and soul unto everlasting life. Amen.”

At the conclusion of the communion, please keep a prayerful silence.

Prayer after Communion

Celebrant Let us pray.

*Standing, the community prays in silence. The celebrant may say the Prayer after Communion appointed for the day. At the conclusion of the prayer the congregation says, **Amen***

Celebrant Glory to God,

All whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine. Glory to God from generation to generation, in the Church and in Christ Jesus, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Apostles' Creed

Please stand, as you are able.

Celebrant Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say,

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Prayers of the People

Each petition will conclude with “Lord, in your mercy” and the congregation is invited to respond with “... hear our prayer.”

Confession

Celebrant Dear friends in Christ, God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy; he welcomes sinners and invites them to his table. Let us confess our sins, confident in God's forgiveness.

Please maintain a prayerful silence.

Celebrant Most merciful God,

All we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen.

Absolution

*The celebrant then pronounces the Absolution, after which the people respond: **Amen***

The Peace

The celebrant addresses the people:

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And also with you.

THE CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST

Celebrant: The Rev'd Robert Clifford

During the anthem bread and wine are presented at the altar and the gifts of the people are brought forward.

*Please stand, as you are able. The celebrant may say the Prayer over the Gifts, following which the people say, **Amen***

Eucharistic Prayer

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The celebrant continues with the Preface, which concludes "...to proclaim the glory of your name."

**All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

The celebrant continues with the Prayer of Consecration, which concludes "we praise you and we bless you."

**All We praise you, we bless you, we give thanks to you,
and we pray to you, Lord our God.**

The celebrant continues with the Prayer of Petition which concludes "in the unity of the Holy Spirit, forever and ever."

All Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Celebrant And now, as our Saviour Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray,

**All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in
heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive
us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass
against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver
us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and
the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

The Breaking of the Bread

Celebrant We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

**All We, being many, are one body,
for we all share in the one bread.**

Celebrant Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

All Therefore let us keep the feast.

The Communion

The celebrant invites the people to share in communion and may say,

The gifts of God for the People of God.

People Thanks be to God.

All baptised Christians are welcome to come forward to receive the church's highest offering to God, the Holy Eucharist. Everyone is welcome to come forward for a blessing. A gluten sensitive option is available, please ask.
