The practice of intinction (dipping the wafer into the wine) is a practice that <u>we</u> discourage. We offer communion in both kinds bread & wine. A common practice for acknowledging the cup without receiving – is to reverently touch the base of the cup when it is presented. An alternative is to simply cross your arms on your chest when offered the chalice.
