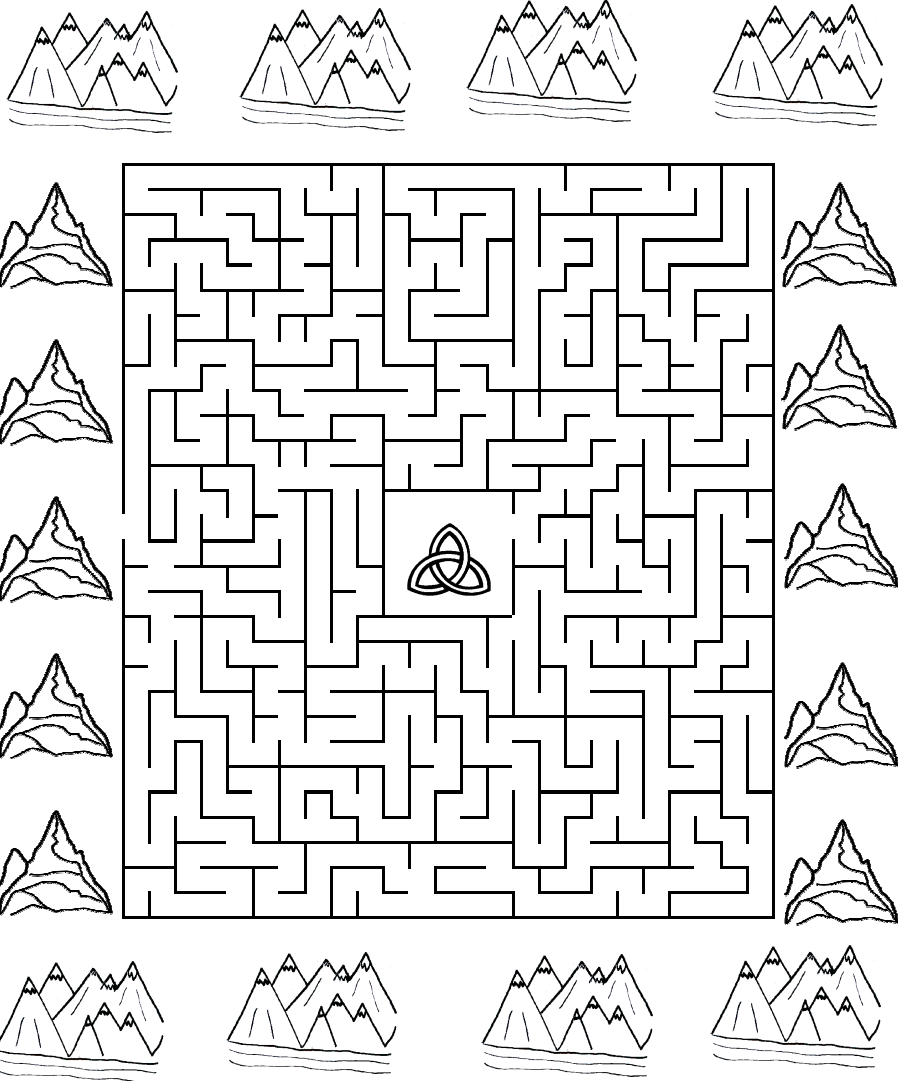


# Mountains surround Jerusalem

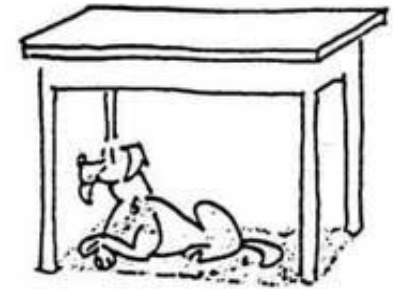
Or so our psalm today says,

But the woman argues with Jesus and she wins: there are crumbs enough to feed the dogs (= non-Jews) as well, and Jesus heals her daughter.

it all depends on how you treat them!

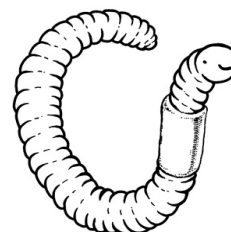
